### What do they need to bring from home?

- •Reading book
- School planner
- •A named water bottle
- A packed lunch, unless your child is having a school dinner.
- Pencil case

Coats are needed for break times
Children should bring a fresh fruit or veg snack. This can often help children's focus until lunchtime, as it is a long morning.

### **Planners**

- Planners are used for us to communicate messages home to you.
- We check these regularly.
- We also encourage parents to communicate with us in the same way to send simple messages and let us know if pick up arrangements change.
- These should be used to record reading at home by you or the children

### **Stationery**

In Year 4, children have their own named pencil cases and equipment. They should be able to fit in their trays and not be too distracting.

They should <u>only</u> have the following equipment:

#### JEWELLERY and MAKE-UP

Children should not wear jewellery to school apart from an analogue watch (no fitbits or digital watches) and a small pair of neutral coloured stud earrings if their ears have been pierced. Children will not be allowed to take part in PE or Games lessons if they are wearing earrings of any kind.

Valuable personal belongings should not be brought to school as staff cannot be held responsible for them.

If parents wish to arrange for their child's ears to be pierced, this should be done at the beginning of the summer holiday so that children are still able to participate in PE lessons during school time.

No make-up including nail varnish should be worn to school.

#### HAIRSTYLES

Hairstyles should be tidy, practical and conservative. Long hair should be tied back (girls and boys). Hair bands should be plain blue or match the child's hair colour. Metal or wooden hair ornaments should not be worn. 'Fashion' hairstyles such as gelled, beaded, coloured or shave-patterned hair or extreme haircuts are not permitted.

#### **BAGS AND OUTERWEAR**

We do recommend children have a book bag with the school logo\* for their day bag or alternatively a suitably sized bag for their belongings. A separate drawstring bag with the school logo\* is needed for their PE kit.

Coats and scarves should be warm and appropriate for school use.

Beanie hats and baseball caps with the school logo can be purchased from the uniform supplier.

These are the uniform expectations. They can be found on Page 9 of your child's planner.

Please make sure ALL items are labelled with your child's name. •PE is on Mondays and Fridays. Please ensure that your child comes to school in their PE kit with their school shoes and a pair of socks in their bag. This is in case the children get their shoes wet or muddy whilst doing PE on the field.

•Please ensure that your child <u>does not</u> come into school wearing earrings on the days that they do PE.

•As the weather gets colder, please ensure that they have a school hoodie and jogging bottoms to keep warm. The children will be going out in all weathers, so please send your child with a light raincoat that can be worn for PE and kept in their cubby holes.

•Please make sure all your children's items are labelled with their names.

•Please can you ensure that children can tie their tie, shoe laces and put their own earrings in if they are sent to school in these.

## <u>Homework</u>

•The children are expected to be practising on TTRockstars and Spelling Shed at least 3 times a week.

 Reading should be completed daily for 15 minutes and recorded in their planners.

•Optional homework will be provided and checked every half term.

# **Times tables**

- Times tables will be tested twice a week.
- It is expected that by the end of year 4, all children know all their times tables up to 12 x 12. This is for the <u>statutory multiplication</u> <u>tables check</u> in June.
- On TT Rockstars, the "Soundcheck" is perfect for practising for the test in June as it times every question. We can track their progress
- TT Rockstars is recommended for times tables practise, but sheets are also available for children to complete if needed. We aim to award certificates when children go up a level on "Studio"

### **Interventions**

You may find your child is receiving additional support to boost their understanding across the curriculum.

This could be in the form of small group work or 1:1 support outside of the classroom. This could be for reading, writing, grammar, handwriting, maths or times tables.

### <u>Creative</u> <u>Curriculum</u>

Curriculum Over the past few years, we have successfully adopted a more holistic approach to teaching and learning which combines English with the wider curriculum.

Across the year, we will have five main units:

- •Blue Abyss •Stone Age
- •Narnia
- •Narnia
- •Romans
- •Italy

Each week will consist of at least one grammar lesson, one reading and three writing lessons with the remaining lessons being dedicated to skills across the wider curriculum. We have found that this approach encourages children to make much clearer links in their learning, inspires better quality writing and promotes higher levels of enthusiasm and engagement.

### <u>Reading</u>

In most of our topics, we have a book that we read alongside our learning.

The first book is "Manfish" which we are not asking you to purchase. We have printed copies for the children to share.

# **RHSE in Year 4**

We teach our RSHE (Relationships, Sex and Health Education) as the Changing Me unit within our Jigsaw PSHE Curriculum.

## RHSE in Year 4

- We usually teach these lessons weekly during the summer term.
- Children are taught in their usual classes.
- We cover a range of topics including the changes humans go through as they change from babies to children to adults.
- We discuss body changes as well as the emotions associated with these changes.
