House Captains

Responsibilities and commitments

- Lead the house during whole school inter-house competitions.
- Help prepare your house for team events.
- Be involved in creating and promoting inter-house competitions.
- Lead team assemblies to give updates to your house.
- To help at whole school events including sports day.

Key skills required

- Respect** – represent your team by listening to all ideas and viewpoints.

Reading Leaders

Responsibilities and commitments

- Assist Miss Hill in maintaining the school library.
- Support other children in selecting books they might enjoy.
- Lead whole school assemblies that promote love of reading.
- Assist Miss Hill with planning whole school reading activities and events e.g. World Book Day
- Promote reading across the school.
- Demonstrate a love and enthusiasm of books.
- Write book reviews to encourage others to read.

Key skills required

Respect – be prepared to support all children and help them learn to love books.

Achieve – be confident in your ability to read aloud to other children 1:1 or in small groups.

Inspire – be a role model who inspires other children to read.

Strive – be ambitious in the choice of books that you read independently.

Encourage – be supportive of all children and have a passion for reading that can be shared with all.

Digital Leaders

Responsibilities and commitments

- Prepare and deliver whole school assemblies about online safety.
- Support teachers in classes to use ICT.
- Share your computing skills and expertise with other pupils and members of staff.
- Lead a coding lunchtime club.

Key skills required

Respect – show you care for all members of our school community by promoting and maintaining a positive digital footprint.

Achieve – be competent and confident in your computing skills to support others.

Inspire – demonstrate an enthusiasm for computing.

Strive – be proactive in ensuring all members of St Ann's Heath have the knowledge required to keep themselves safe online.

Encourage – encourage and support others to keep themselves safe online.

Site Leaders (indoor)

Subject Leaders

Office Admin Leaders

- Be the pupil link with the office.
- Distribute Christmas cards.
- Support FOSAH with in school admin tasks.

Achieve – want the school to run efficiently.
Inspire – promote organisation within the school.
Strive – demonstrate your organisation skills and neatness at all times.
Encourage – support others with their organisation and encourage strong links between school staff, children and parents.
