We would also like to express our thanks to our governing body, who provide support and careful oversight throughout the year. Their work behind the scenes plays a vital role in the continued success and development of our school.

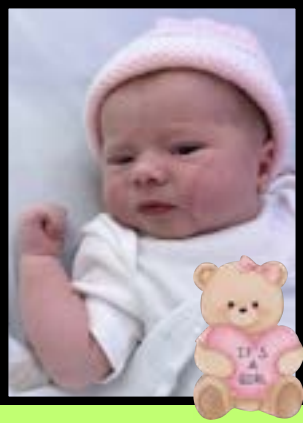

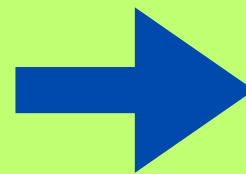

Attendance Information

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. Inset training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Please take note of the information on term-time absence. It is essential that you inform us of any absence (illness or holiday).

What a busy and exciting half term it's been in Year 6 - where do we even begin?

The highlight for many was our unforgettable residential trip to Condover Hall, where both children and staff stepped well outside their comfort zones. From abseiling and raft building to archery and more, everyone embraced the adventure with enthusiasm and courage.

Back at school, we've been diving into the Victorian era in our Creative Curriculum. Our Victorian Wow Day gave the children a taste of what school life was like in the 1800s - a real eye-opener that made many appreciate just how lucky they are today!

We've also been exploring how our local area has changed since Victorian times, brought vividly to life through a local walk, including a visit to Victoria Park - once the site of Holloway Sanatorium, an institution for those experiencing temporary mental illness in the late 1800s.

In class, we uncovered the harsh realities of child labour during the Industrial Revolution and even wrote persuasive letters to Queen Victoria, urging her to ban such inhumane practices.

And of course, we took to the stage in our spectacular production of *Annie* - what a show it was!

Finally, our Leavers' Ball marks the end of an incredible journey at St Ann's Heath. We are so proud of everything Year 6 has achieved and can't wait to see what adventures lie ahead as they begin their next chapter at secondary school.





We've also enjoyed some fantastic sessions at Forest School this half term, embracing the sense of freedom, adventure and friendship that comes from learning and exploring together in nature.



Y6 Maths Helpers

Several keen mathematicians in year 6 were asked to help out with a shape day for Year 4. We hope you enjoy this special showcase of SAIL work from across the year – a celebration of growth, grit and great leadership!



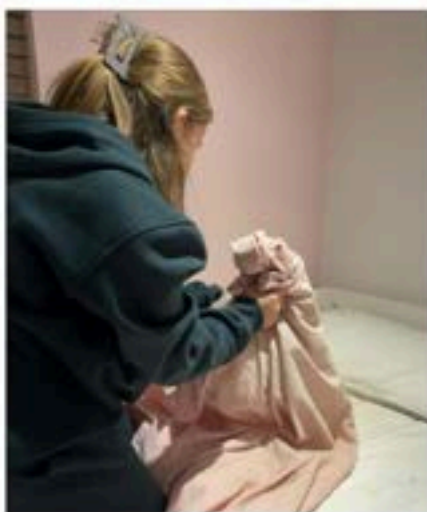
