
Lower School stepping into THE STONE AGE









Year 5




In Year 5, we have been learning about the Titanic. We started with a WOW day where we learnt about what life was like on the Titanic, the differences between class (1st, 2nd and 3rd), how the Titanic was made and how it sunk. In second class we investigated how bulkheads work and thought about why Titanic sank. Next, we looked at different sources from 1912 to investigate how reliable different information was at the time of the Titanic's voyage and sinking. Using our class text, The Titanic Detective Agency, we wrote diary entries based on the main characters (Bertha and Johan). In maths, we have been learning about the place value of numbers up to 1,000,000, as well as addition and subtraction. In science, we have been learning about unbalanced forces.

Can I collate information from different sources to understand the events that led to WWI?

Key Vocabulary

- Alliance:** An agreement made between two or more countries to give each other help if it was needed. These alliances meant that any conflict involving one country could quickly involve others.
- Triple Entente:** an alliance between France, Russia and Britain.
- Triple Alliance:** an alliance between Germany, Austria Hungary, and Italy.
- Imperialism:** European nations were competing for colonies and territories.
- Nationalism:** National pride in their own country. This national pride often led to conflicts between countries.
- Colonial:** land settlers to be placed and establish political control over it.
- Conscription:** All men, who were healthy and able, were to join the army when they were called upon. It was the law.
- Ally:** a state or country formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose.
- Neutral:** not taking any side in an argument or conflict.
- Chronology:** placing events in the order they happened (from earliest to latest).

On the 28th June 1914 the heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary, Archduke Franz Ferdinand was shot. He was assassinated by the Serbian group, the Black Hand. After several attempts, the monarch Gavrilo Princip finally ended the Archduke.

Austria-Hungary

Austria-Hungary declared war with Serbia after a month of pleading. Russia decided to prepare their army since they were allies with Serbia. Germany didn't like this so they went to war with Russia on the 3rd August 1914.

France had a treaty with Russia so France helped Russia fight Germany. Germany declares war (yet again) on France on the 3rd August 1914.

Germany wanted to defeat France quickly. They thought the only way was to go through neutral Belgium to surprise attack France. Britain didn't like this and tried to stop them.

Britain declared war with Germany since they refused and went through Belgium anyway. This happened on the 4th August 1914. The World War had begun.

7 Top Tips to Support Key Stage 2 Children Reading at Home

Shared reading is a great way to develop children's language and communication and to boost their reading skills. Regular reading routines can offer lots of opportunities for learning during school closures—these tips are aimed at supporting children in Key Stage 2.

1 Concentrate on reading quality (it isn't all about reading lots!)



Don't worry too much about the 'what' and 'how' of reading each day. Books are great—but leaflets, comics, recipes and instructions on a webpage can all be great too. Why not set your child a reading challenge: How many different things can you read in a day?

2 Ask your child lots of questions



All reading matters. Shared reading is about 'reading with', not just 'reading to'. Why not take turns to read a page each of a longer novel? So, ask lots of 'Wh' questions, such as 'Who? What? When? Where? Why?' Try them when talking about books: for example, 'what do you think Harry is feeling?'

3 Ask your child to make predictions about what they have read



If it is a book, look at the front cover—or the last chapter—and talk about what might happen next. Look for clues in the book and be a reading detective! For example, 'can you see the fox on the front cover? Why do you think he's so sad?'

4 Ask your child to summarise what they have read



When you've finished reading, talk about what happened. Think about how the characters behaved and interesting things that happened in the plot. You could encourage your child to keep a **reading diary**, describing the big idea of each chapter.

5 Ask your child to write about what they have read



Write, or draw pictures, from anything you've read! Big writing and pictures are even more fun. For example, use an old roll of wallpaper (or chalk on a path) and draw around your child. Ask them to fill the outline with lots of information about the main character.

6 Read and discuss reading with friends or family



Make books a part of the family. Encourage your child to share them with a relative or friend, over a video call. Laugh about them when you are making meals together. For example, 'you could use your slimepower to help me cook tea tonight.'

7 Maintain the motivation to read



Talk about the joy of reading whenever you can. Give your child choices about what they read, being in control is great motivation! Encourage them to recommend books to family and friends. For example, 'you should read this book, Grandad, because you love funny stories.'




