LOWER SCHOOL

This term, our Lower School pupils have been immersed in the fascinating world of the Romans, exploring how the Roman Empire conquered much of the known world and the lasting impact it had on Britain. They have discovered the inspiring story of Boudica's courageous resistance, written persuasive speeches and letters from different historical perspectives, investigated the discipline and training of Roman soldiers, and learned about the significance of Hadrian's Wall.



To bring their learning to life, the children stepped back in time for an unforgettable Roman WOW Day. They designed and crafted their own Roman shields before taking part in soldier recruitment, training, and battle formations, experiencing the teamwork and discipline that made the Roman army so formidable.



A particular highlight of the day was an engaging workshop led by Chertsey Museum, where pupils explored authentic Roman artefacts and collaborated to build a Roman temple. Through these hands-on experiences, history came vividly to life, inspiring curiosity, creativity, and a deeper appreciation of Roman Britain. It has been a truly memorable and enriching start to their Roman journey.



Our Lower School pupils delighted in the magic of Forest School, where every woodland adventure became an opportunity to discover insect habitats, identify a variety of plant species, and enjoy enchanting stories beneath the trees. Surrounded by the beauty of the natural world, the children developed confidence, curiosity, resilience, and teamwork as they created, investigated, and forged meaningful connections with nature.



From uncovering hidden woodland treasures beneath a carpet of leaves to embracing exciting challenges such as climbing trees, every experience sparked imagination, strengthened critical thinking, and nurtured a lasting appreciation for the natural world. Whether building dens, exploring habitats, solving practical problems, or taking carefully managed risks, the children approached each adventure with boundless enthusiasm, courage, and a true spirit of exploration.



Forest School reminds us that some of the richest learning takes place beyond the classroom walls, where muddy boots, curious minds, and joyful laughter come together to create lasting memories. We are immensely proud of the courage, kindness, and determination our pupils demonstrated throughout their Forest School journey and look forward to many more inspiring adventures beneath the trees.





This term, our pupils were delighted to take part in Runnymede Borough Council's *The Great Big Green Week*, enjoying an inspiring LEGO® workshop that brought sustainability, creativity, and teamwork to life. Working collaboratively, the children were challenged to design and build a sustainable community centre for people in need of companionship and support, showcasing their imagination while exploring innovative solutions for a greener, kinder future. We were especially honoured to welcome the Mayor of Runnymede, Steve Ringham, who worked alongside the children, listened to their thoughtful ideas, and celebrated the creativity and ingenuity behind their impressive designs.



The workshop was a truly enriching experience, developing the children's collaboration, communication, and problem-solving skills while deepening their understanding of what it means to be *green* and the positive impact each of us can have on our communities. Throughout the day, our pupils were exemplary ambassadors for St Ann's Heath, representing the school with confidence, courtesy, and maturity. Their enthusiasm, articulate ideas, and impeccable behaviour made us immensely proud as they shared their vision for a more sustainable future with the Mayor of Runnymede.

Year 6

What a busy and exciting half term it has been in Year 6!

A real highlight for many was our unforgettable residential trip to Condover Hall, where both children and staff stepped outside their comfort zones. From rock climbing and raft building to high ropes and more, everyone embraced the challenges with enthusiasm, resilience and courage.

Back at school, our Creative Curriculum has taken us back to the Victorian era. We have explored how Queen Victoria's reign was a time of great change, from the impact of the Industrial Revolution and new inventions, to the harsh realities of child labour and the expansion of the British Empire.

We have also explored how our local area has changed since Victorian times, bringing history to life on a local walk, including a visit to Virginia Park, once the site of Holloway Sanatorium.

In class, we learned all about the harsh realities of child labour during the Industrial Revolution and wrote persuasive letters to Queen Victoria, urging her to end such cruel practices.

In our Human Body topic, we have been learning about the circulatory system and the important roles of the heart, blood vessels and blood. Our learning was brought to life when Dr Metcalfe visited and gave us the opportunity to dissect a lamb's heart, helping us see first-hand how it all works.

Of course, one of the biggest highlights has been rehearsing for and performing our fantastic production: *The Pirates of The Curry Bean*. The children's confidence, teamwork and talent have shone through, and they should be incredibly proud.

Finally, our Leavers' Ball marks the end of a wonderful journey at St Ann's Heath. We are so proud of all that Year 6 has achieved and wish them every success as they begin their next chapter at secondary school.





We've also enjoyed some fantastic Forest School sessions this half term, embracing the freedom, adventure and friendships that come from learning and exploring together in the natural world.





This year, our fantastic Year 6 pupils embarked on the SAIL project – a new journey in personal growth, leadership and citizenship. Through the programme, children have explored what it means to be an effective leader, developed essential life skills, and discovered strengths they will carry with them well beyond primary school.

Every two weeks, a new leadership challenge was launched, ranging from teamwork and problem-solving to resilience and responsibility. These were introduced in class and completed at home, giving pupils the opportunity to apply their skills in real-life situations.

This half term, we reached our final challenge: public speaking. Pupils confidently presented on the leadership roles they had taken on and the skills they had developed throughout the year.

To celebrate those who completed all 16 challenges, a special Headteacher's Tea Party was held – a well-deserved reward for their dedication and commitment.

We hope you enjoy this showcase of SAIL work from across the year – a celebration of growth, grit and outstanding leadership.

SURREY NURTURING SCHOOLS PROGRAMME

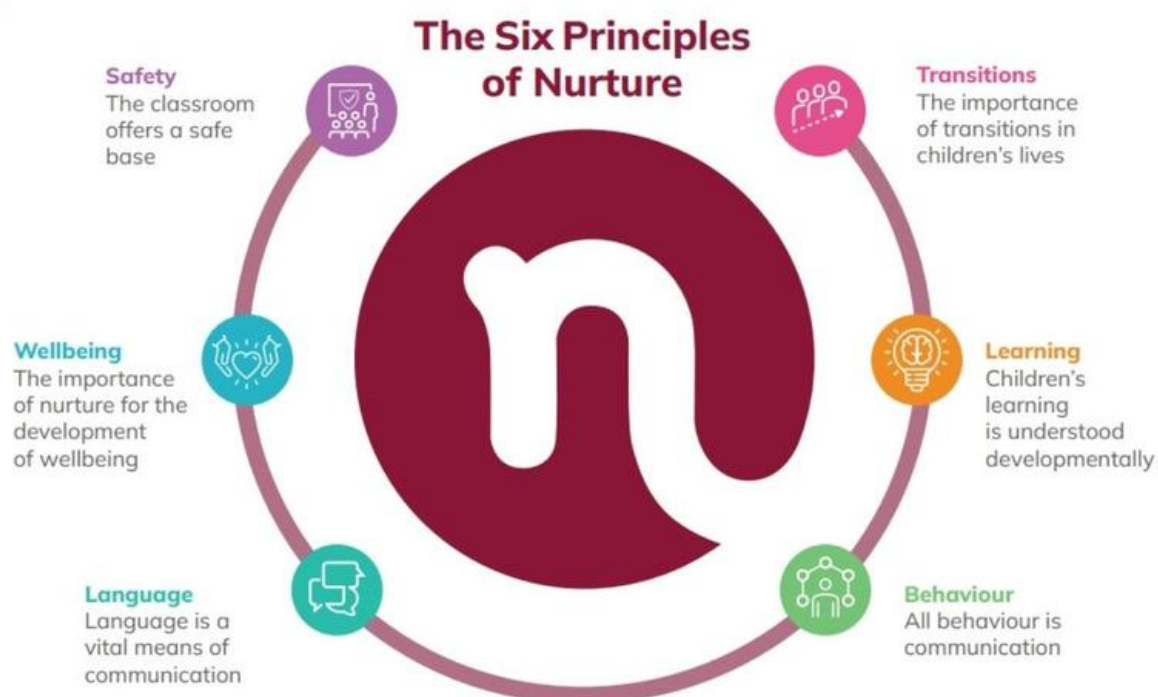

Summary of Pupil Voice Responses April 2026



YOUR VOICE ♥ OUR SCHOOL ♥ OUR FUTURE



OVERVIEW

This document captures pupil voice discussions held in April 2026 with children in Years 3–6. Overall, pupils speak very positively about their school experience, highlighting strong feelings of safety, belonging, and enjoyment, alongside constructive suggestions for improvement—particularly around playtimes, equipment, and consistency in rewards and behaviour systems.



1. SAFETY & WELLBEING

- Pupils feel safe in school.
- They know who to talk to if they feel worried (teachers, LSAs, staff with grey lanyards).
- Adults listen, act quickly and take concerns seriously.
- Teaching about healthy relationships, friendship and conflict resolution (PSHE) is understood and used in real life.



2. BEHAVIOUR & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

- Good behaviour means being calm, respectful and focused.
- Issues usually involve a small minority and are dealt with quickly.
- Some older pupils feel children who struggle sometimes get more recognition than those who always behave well and work hard.
- Pupils understand consequences clearly: warnings, loss of break time and Headteacher involvement if needed.



3. REWARDS & RECOGNITION

- Rewards include stickers, house points, praise, feedback, assemblies, raffle tickets, gold awards, extra playtime and iPad time.
- Pupils appreciate recognition but want more fairness and consistency, especially for those who always behave well.
- Year 6 pupils raised concerns about the house points system:
 - Potential misuse (children entering their own points).
 - Need for a more secure and transparent system.



LEADERSHIP & RESPONSIBILITY (KEY STRENGTH IN YEAR 6)



- Year 6 pupils value their leadership roles (e.g. Digital, Curriculum, Reading, Wellbeing, House Captains).
- Benefits identified:
