- Handwriting is neat and joined

- No felt tip pens
- No gel pens for colouring
- Sketches and drawings must be in pencil

- Short date
- Learning question written at the top of work
- One line left between date and learning question
- Date and learning question underlined with a ruler and pencil
- One number per square
- Work in pencil
- Margin must be two squares wide, drawn with a ruler
